Managing Delays and Noise

While these are unavoidable works, the Port of Melbourne Corporation is conscious of the potential impacts on local residents and businesses. The Project's strict Environmental Management Plan and the Environmental Protection Authority's noise guidelines will be at the fore of all construction activities.

The contractor will be undertaking active monitoring of noise. Port of Melbourne Corporation staff will be on-site to monitor the works across the entire weekend and during the lead up works which occur nightly in the week prior to each weekend closure.





It is estimated that the temporary detours will add around 15 minutes to existing trip times. The construction contractor will have traffic management staff onsite throughout the works.

VicRoads Traffic Control Centre will also be involved in monitoring conditions.

The contractor will not commence setting up the detours before 8pm Friday and will cease all works allowing sufficient time for the roads to be re-opened at 5am before the start of the morning peak hour.



DELAYS

Noise modelling has been undertaken to plan the works and the contractor is responding to the study findings by implementing a range of measures to reduce night time noise including staging of work; involving louder equipment such as rock breakers in the early part of the night, acoustic shielding and even arranging truck movements so as to reduce the use of reversing beepers.

It is expected that louder activities such as saw cutting and rock breaking may be audible and for this reason these activities are being staged on Friday nights while quieter works such as pavement laying and line marking will be carried out on Saturday and Sunday nights.




